Staff Training: Group home staff must pass a comprehensive pre-employment test, interview and background checks.

DSI has a rigorous training program for staff which includes CPR/First Aid, Bloodborne Pathogens, Seizure First Aid, Client Rights, Client Protection, protection from Abuse/Neglect/Exploitation, Incident Reporting, Defensive Driving, Crisis Intervention, Medication Orientation, Medication Administration, and Core A and Core B Medication Training.

DSI and the Department of Labor have partnered in the Client Service Specialist Apprenticeship Program which requires 3,000 working hours and 226.5 training hours to complete.

Staff must complete a variety of training, some of which require re-certification on an annual or biannual basis and all employees must keep their training up-to-date at all times to retain their apprenticeship status.

DSI's award-winning training program is a model in the State of Indiana and is certified by the Department of Labor.

Purpose: DSI group homes blend into community neighborhoods and serve between five and eight individuals. Residents learn daily living skills that help them achieve the highest level of independence possible in areas such as cooking, clothing care, house-keeping, and money management. Group Homes also provide opportunities for participation in recreational, social and learning experiences in the community.

Experience: DSI has been a leader in providing quality services to individuals with disabilities since 1975. We are currently in 30 counties and will be expanding our services throughout the state of Indiana.

Philosophy: DSI's Group Homes provide the most non-restrictive and natural environment possible for individuals to learn and grow through an individualized, person-centered approach.

Quality: Group Homes are audited for quality care by the State Department of Health, Long Term Care Division; Family and Social Services Long Term Care Team; and the Fire Marshall's Office. The homes are licensed by the Division of Disability and Rehabilitation's Community Residential Facilities Council. Also, client, family and guardian input is used as an important part of the quality assurance process.

Developmental Services, Inc. is a 501-C-3 not-for-profit organization that provides services for adults and children with mental, physical, and emotional disabilities. DSI was established in 1975 and provides residential living situations, job training and placement, respite care, family support, early intervention and many other services listed on our website.

DSI receives financial support from local Arc's, County Commissioners, individual and group contributions, local, state, and federal funds, Indiana Division on Aging and Rehabilitative Services, United Funds, and the United Way.

All of the services provided by DSI are approved or certified by the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration, Indiana Department of Public Instruction and the Indiana State Board of Health.
