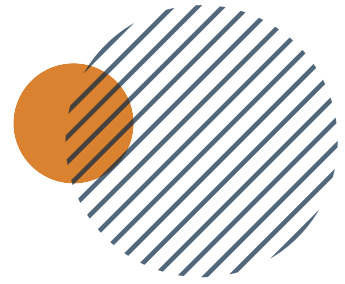

## Children's Services

Our agency provides high quality programming that meets the highest standards.

### BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT FOR CHILDREN

This service offers functional behavior assessments and support plans as well as social skills training, staff/family/caregiver training, and 24-hour emergency services.

### FIRST STEPS

Through First Steps, DSI provides early intervention, therapy, family support, and service networking for infants and toddlers who are at-risk or face developmental challenges.

### KEYS FOR KIDS EARLY EDUCATION CENTER

Provides a safe and positive learning environment for children of all abilities while utilizing a research based curriculum and implementing developmentally appropriate practices.

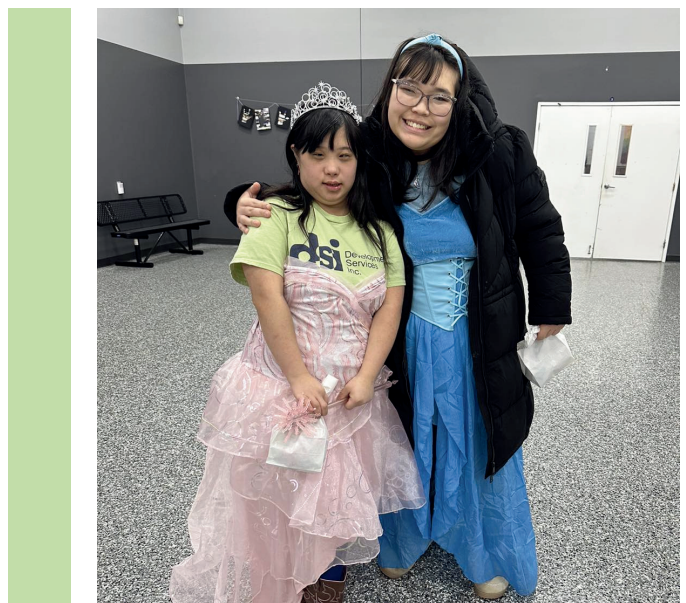

### REACH FOR CHILDREN

#### (Reaching Every Adult and Child's Home)

REACH provides in-home and community based services and education for individuals with disabilities to give families or care providers time away from their considerable responsibilities.





## Adult Programs

Over 2,000 clients are served daily in Indiana by our wide array of adult programs. Each of these programs is designed to provide quality enrichment at the highest standards.



### ADULT DAY PROGRAMMING & HABILITATION SERVICES

DSI's Habilitation services are designed to promote health, welfare and the maximum potential of individuals. This includes developing social behaviors, interpersonal skills and cognitive skills such as handling emergencies, managing money and solving problems. Clients can also take advantage of recreation and leisure time to discover new interests.

### BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT FOR ADULTS

Therapists work alongside the individual's team, consisting of staff, family, and case management, to identify behavioral challenges that hinder the individual from reaching their maximum potential. They put together strategies through a behavior support plan to monitor and appropriately address behavioral concerns.

### EDUCATION & ENRICHMENT

The E & E service model provides the platform and resources for clients of DSI to explore talents and interests such as fine art, cooking, computer literacy, wellness, recreation and gardening. Other E & E benefits include greater community integration, team building, enhanced social and physical development and a sense of pride.

### GROUP HOMES

Group homes provide a clean and comfortable environment, and the support and guidance to help those with special needs be as independent as possible. Residents learn daily living skills that help them become more independent. Residents share a spacious room with one other person and many home amenities are provided. These include transportation, group activities and community outings.



- We served 601 clients through Adult Day Programming & Habilitation Services
- We served 130 clients in Group Homes
- We served 167 clients through Behavior Management

## Adult Programs

**Our adult programs are uniquely designed to help each individual with their personal goals. Reaching these personal milestones empowers them with a new set of skills and newfound sense of independence.**

### PERSONAL ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (PEP)

PEP is an alternative program opportunity for individuals who desire meaningful day activities. These can include community and facility-based habilitation which focus on gaining a myriad of skills to help people with disabilities live more independently.

### PRE-EMPLOYMENT TRANSITION SERVICES

Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) is for students with disabilities in need of services who are eligible or potentially eligible for Vocational Rehabilitation services.

### REACH FOR ADULTS (Reaching Every Adult and Child's Home)

REACH provides in-home, (Respite) and community based services and education for individuals with disabilities to give families or care providers time off from their considerable responsibilities.

- We served 260 clients through REACH
- We served 287 clients through Supported Living
- We served 163 clients through Wellness Coordination

### SUPPORTED LIVING

Supported Living is an alternative to institutional care and offers family-oriented services for eligible adults with developmental delays as well as mental, physical, or emotional challenges. Our staff assists these individuals to become as independent as possible. Many, in fact, live in their own home. Based on a person's needs, Supported Living Services can be provided for as little as four hours per month to 24 hours per day. Services are provided in an individual's home setting and in the community.

### TRANSPORTATION

DSI provides transportation for clients so that they may access services.

### WELLNESS COORDINATION

Services are based on the development, maintenance, and routine monitoring of the client's wellness coordination plan. This program extends beyond those services provided through routine doctor/healthcare visits and is specifically designed for clients requiring assistance of a Registered Nurse (RN) or Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) to properly coordinate their medical needs.





## Community Services

DSI offers a variety of quality services to businesses and individuals to meet their needs. Within our Community Service programming, clients can receive job exploration counseling, work-based learning experiences, counseling on opportunities for enrollment in postsecondary education, workplace readiness and instruction in self-advocacy.

### EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Driven by client choice, Employment Service staff complete a job analysis for every potential employee to determine the requirements of the job and the employer's needs. Follow-Along staff ensure the job match is going smoothly by working directly with the new employee and the employer.

### PRE-EMPLOYMENT TRANSITION SERVICES

Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) is for students with disabilities in need of services who are eligible or potentially eligible for Vocational Rehabilitation services.

### INDUSTRIAL SERVICES

DSI Industries delivers quality, efficient, and cost-effective sub-contracting business solutions to our customers. We operate under 9001:2015 certification which means high-quality system standards for your business.

### RIDE SOLUTION

DSI provides transportation for clients so that they may access services. Ride Solutions is a coordinated public transportation system serving ten counties.

- We served 962 students through Pre-ETS



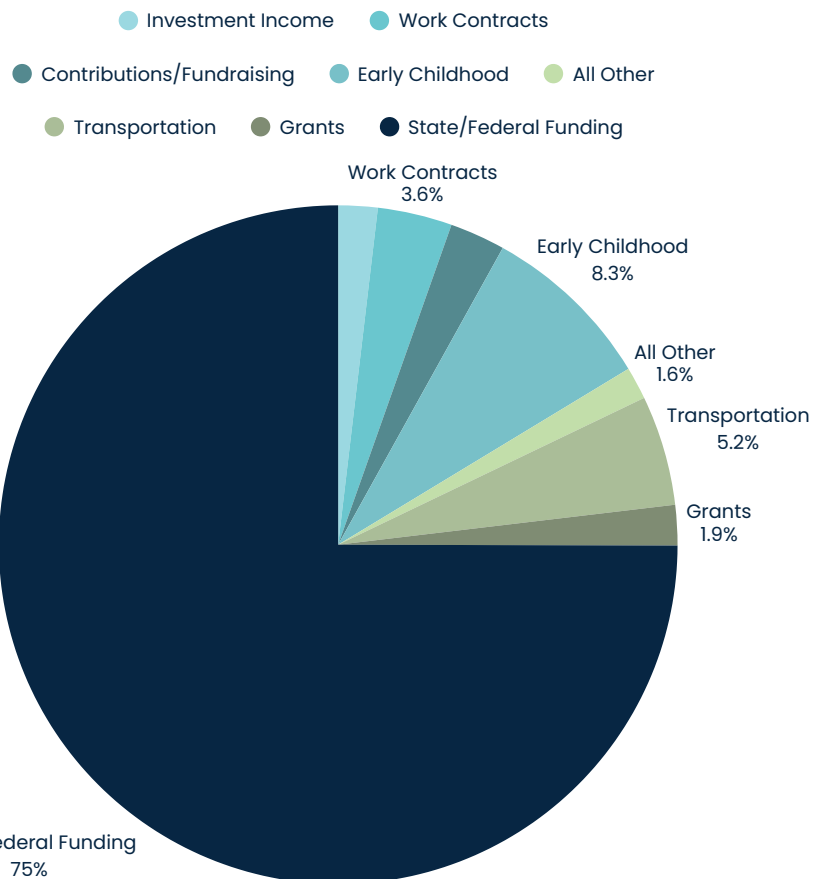

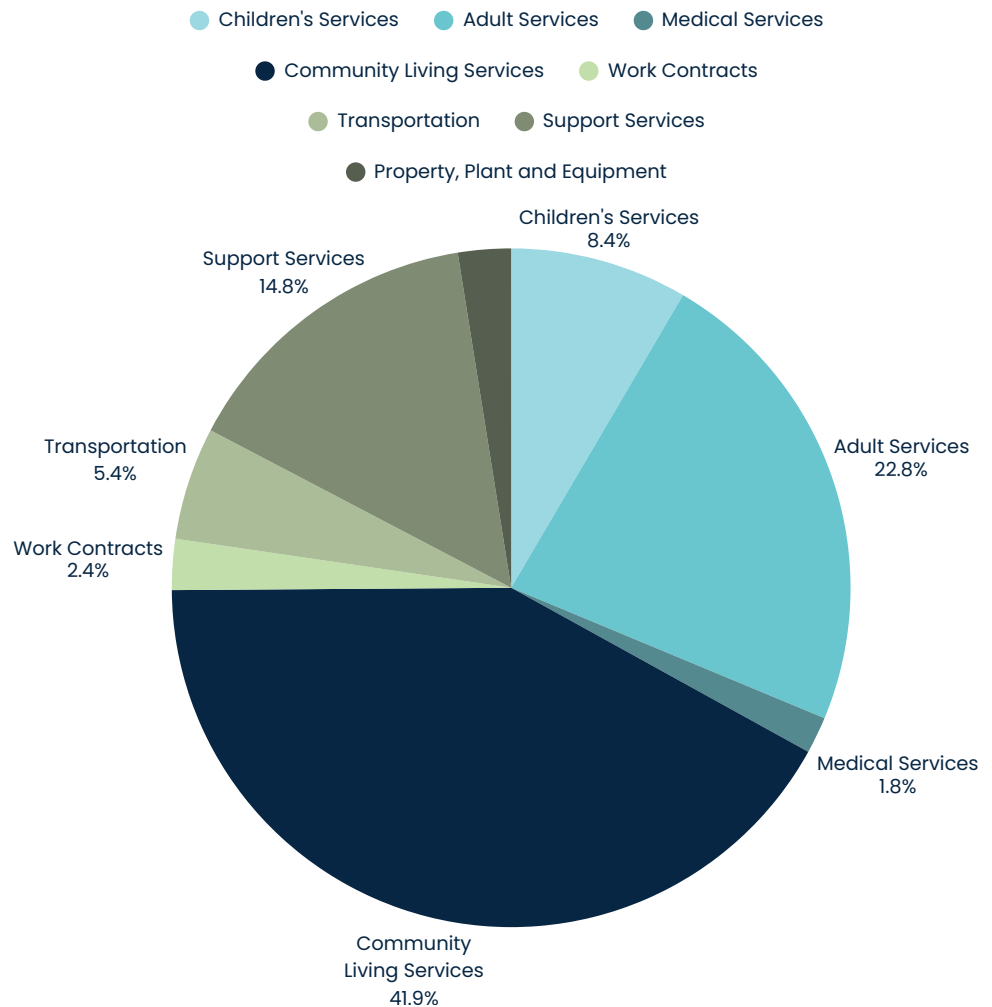
